- 21 months paid employment at £23,000-£28,000 per annum

- Regular guidance from an individual mentor
- Support in securing a permanent role in housing and regeneration at the end of the programme

The Emerging Talent Programme is aimed at individuals from ethnic minority communities who have a strong motivation to work in this sector. The recruitment process will be in 3 stages. All candidates must submit a completed application form by Monday 1st November. Candidates with strong applications will be invited to an interview. Success there will be followed by an online assessment centre to select those who will be offered a place on the programme in December. Placements will start work at the end of January 2022.
