## Introduction

This Strategic Plan sets out the direction for the ISHA Group over the next 5 years. It reflects the priorities for improvement set by the Board and includes valuable contributions from our residents and key stakeholders. We have called our strategic plan "Speaking up for Housing", which ISHA has been doing for over 80 years, and our Residents' Forum clearly and loudly said in August 2014 that they wanted ISHA to continue to do this. We have set an ambitious plan to place ISHA and Lien Viet in a leading position within the social housing sector.



We want to meet the challenges of the lack of affordable homes in London delivering 400 new homes by 2020. We live in an age of increasing expectations of service delivery and the use of new technology and social media. By the end of the planned period we will have delivered radical improvements in four key areas:

At the same time, maintaining our financial viability is the first priority which underpins our four core objectives. The foundations of these are through our robust business planning and risk and control framework that monitors the achievement of our ambitions:
